Sir,

With reference to your Confidential despatch of the 5th of September, I have the honour to inform you that Mr S.P. Molloy has tendered the resignation of his appointment as 4th Grade Clerk in the Treasury, and that I have accepted it with effect from the 5th of October.

2. Mr Molloy was on his return from leave detailed for work at Mombasa and has given this transfer as the reason for his resignation. I understand however that he has been offered private employment at a larger remuneration than his present salary, and am inclined to think that his transfer to Mombasa is a secondary consideration.

3. Under Section 13 of the Terms of Service for the Non-European Clerical Staff Mr Molloy may be called upon to refund the cost of his passage to Mombasa on return from leave. I have, however, taking all the circumstances into consideration, considered it advisable to waive the repayment in this instance.
