Plague measures at Mombasa
Employment of Dr. Freitas

As Dr. Freitas is a private practitioner, assumed that expenses detailed in form dat. 656, 21 Aug, and chargeable to S.A.P. funds.

Mr. Read

I have had search made as to Dr. Freitas' employment in Z'bar & the Rs 400 pm. mentioned in 32003.

Dr. F. was temporarily employed as M.O. Pemba, during gaps (F.O. paper 20457/100) & he may have since been employed on plague work, but there is no evidence of this although Dr. Spencer's being suggested here makes it likely. It is unlikely that the Rs 400 for the Pemba work or for plague work, if any, does not appear.

In any case, there is evidently no Z'bar to continue, & S.A.P. must bear the whole cost on its Mombasa purposes.
