The case of Mr. St. James, Headmaster of the European School, E.A.P., affords a precedent in an allowance of this kind. Mr. St. James visited Switzerland and Italy to study educational systems. He was granted a lump sum of £50 and was away from the middle of November to the end of March. (4½ months)

In answer to your letter N. 10241/1913 of the  
2<sup>nd</sup> inst. I have the honour to inform you that a

I would suggest the advisability of an interview with  
an Engineer on the Crown Agents' Staff, which could be  
effected when next I am in London.

It is also, I consider desirable that I should visit  
the laboratories at the Serum Institute at Berlin and  
Budapest, and possibly also that in Paris, before arriving  
at a decision, and I would enquire whether this tour  
may be undertaken at the expense of Government.
