SIR,

Mr. J. H. Williams desires me to inform you that the total expenditure to date down to the 31st March 1912, was £10,000. Accounts were made up upon livestock, carts, waggons, harness, bullocks, tools, plant & equipment, farm improve. mts., fences, & roads, & trees, and a proportion of London expenses. The total amount of the accounts was £7,000. The stock amounting to £16,000, the proceeds of which have been re-invested in the business, have not been included in this total.

The sheep lost from the farm, viz. 100, & the cattle, viz. 100, & the pigs, etc., have been sold to the 10th Sep. 1912, at a total value of £1,000.

The stock returned to the 31st March 1912, was valued at £16,000, the percentage of losses thereon being 25% but the information is available, and the whole amount of the stock should be shown to be £16,000.
