Sir,

I have the honour to recommend for your favourable consideration the grant of an acting allowance of Rs. 20 per mensam to the 2nd Grade Clerk Mr. J. Mendonça for the period during which he acted for Mr. Hunt, the European Head Clerk at Kisumu, viz: March, 24th to November 29th 1913.

2. It is true that Mr. Hunt was on full pay during his leave and there are, therefore, no savings available but funds could be found from unexpended balances on the Public Works Department schedule if the grant of the allowance is considered permissible.

3. The case differs from that of Mr. Stuart dealt with in your despatch No. 134 of March 6th 1912, inasmuch as Mr. Mendonça, being a member of the Non-European Subordinate Staff, does not benefit by the new Rules and will not draw full pay when he himself proceeds on leave in due course. I understand that the additional duties which devolved upon him in consequence of Mr. Hunt's absence were heavy and were discharged


