I have the honour to recommend for your favourable consideration the grant of an acting allowance of Rs. 20 per mensem to the 2nd Grade Clerk Mr. J. Mendonça for the period during which he acted for Mr. Hunt, the European Head Clerk at Kisumu, viz: March, 24th to November 29th 1943.

2. It is true that Mr. Hunt was on full pay during his leave and there are, therefore, no savings available but funds could be found from unexpended balances on the Public Works Department schedule if the grant of the allowance is considered permissible.


