Confidential of the 30th of June 1911. The last named, however, whose work calls for special commendation, might be considered for the appointment of Quartermaster if and when that appointment becomes vacant. Inspector Hudson, who is senior to Inspector Bristow, is also unfitted socially for promotion.

4. For promotion to the rank of Inspector I recommend the two senior Assistant Inspectors F. Roberts and A.H. Miller. I consider it advisable that the question of filling the remaining vacancy should remain in abeyance for the present.

5. I propose to sanction the promotion of the only two 1st Grade Constables V. Allan and E.G. Smith to the rank of Assistant Inspector. These Constables are well reported on by the officers under whom they are serving and have passed both the Lower Swahili and the Departmental examinations. The Commissioner of Police is unable to recommend a third Constable for promotion at present but hopes to be in a position to do so early in the next financial year.

6. I will address you in a further despatch with regard to the vacancies in the various grades of Constable and, in the meantime, I trust that my proposals will meet with your approval.
