Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the correspondence ending with your despatch No. 524 of August 19th, 1912, on the subject of the grant of an allowance of £60 per annum to Mr. Rodrigues for keeping the loan accounts of the Protectorate.

2. In 1912 the expenditure of the Protectorate was restricted by the half and half principle and it was not considered desirable at that time to add to expenditure anything that could reasonably be charged to loan funds and this allowance was accordingly debited to the latter.

Circumstances have now however altered and it seems moreover every likelihood of loan accounts being more or less a permanent feature of the Protectorate accounts.

3. In view therefore of these changed conditions

conditions I recommend that the allowance now drawn by Mr. Rodrigues be included in the sum of his personal emoluments and shown in the Estimates for 1915-16 with a footnote to the effect that the salary is personal to him.

4. The immediate pecuniary result of this would be of no direct advantage to Mr. Rodrigues but it would enable him to draw half the amount when on leave and would moreover allow of his pension being reckoned on a higher scale.

5. The Treasurer speaks in the highest terms of Mr. Rodrigues' work and remarks that he has served Government loyally and faithfully for over 17 years and should be able to do so for some time to come.

6. I should be glad therefore if you could sanction this proposal and permit the necessary provision to be made for the same.
