I hear daily of your doings. Wisdom does not lie therein. Listen again to my words:


Govt. will not make peace with the Rer Balleh and a few Tari Samantars only. You must all come for peace.

The Govt is very tired of Marhan Fitna. The Govt is unable to wait longer. Hear my words. Leave your present places at once. Leave them today. Go to Dableh with all speed. Stop not on the way. Go only.

A big Force is coming here. If it finds you on the Dilhara or at Bakti Hill it will eat you up. You have six days of which to day is one before the Force comes to your present places.

I beg to report for your information the following were the dispositions of the Marehan on the 1st instant.

Hostile Marehan. Fer Sullah, about 500 men, with 200 rifles and 20 ponies, are at DELLI and near DEKAGIN with a few illaloes at BOGORI, the latter to waylay runners or small safaris on the SEYNNI-GARBAHARI road. The Fer Hassan, Fer Ahmed Ved, and Fer Alidera are almost all together at HUMALI, MACALLA, and KURMISODOCO reading the Koran with about 60 scouts at ASOMADIRI. Some stock and a few men on DILHARA which will be dry about 15th instant.

The Fer Hassan number about 900 men with 400 rifles. The Fer Ahmed Ved about 800 men, 150 rifles and 80 ponies. (with Fer Garad and Fer Ali Hussein).

The Fer Alidera about 250 men, 150 rifles and 10 ponies. Total force approximate 1650 men, 900 rifles, 90 ponies. As far as I can find out the average amount of ammunition is about 20 rounds per rifle. Ammunition is still being bought from the Sheikh Aoul and Shir Mori who do gun-running between Dolo and Lugh.

On the 25th ultimo the O.C. Garbahari received a letter from the Marehan, saying they wanted peace and on the 30th ult. they sent in another to the same effect. In these letters, the O.C. Garbahare replied on the 31st ult. to the effect that the Government would not discuss peace until the Fer Alidera, Fer Sullah, Fer Ahmed Ved and Fer Hassan had brought in every rifle, every pony and every cartridge as ordered to be brought in by 15th August last.

These letters were in my opinion sent simply to gain time.

Don Marehan. On the 29th ult. the O.C. Garbahari had a

letter from the Bon Marehan, supposed friends of the Government, to the effect that they were living at SURGAJUD. On the 31st ult. the O.C. Garbahari, replied that they must obey the orders of the Government at once and move to SHMAU away from the hostile Marehan; a runner came in here yesterday who states that they have already started moving as ordered.

Ar Ogas. The Ar Ogas, also friends of the Government have moved to WASHAKABAR-JUBBEH-BUSSET.

I do not think that either the Ar Ogas or Bon Marehan mean to fight the Government, although from reports received there seems to be a good deal of plotting going on; these last two Sections are I think just waiting to see the result of the first fight and in the event of the Govt. suffering a reverse I think it quite likely that they might combine with the other hostile Marehan against us.

In addition to the sections mentioned above, there are the Merille, a poor low class tribe numbers unknown; the Fer Kulu division of the Merille are I hear with the enemy but they as are not of much account.

The water is fast drying up and by the 15th of this month the Pilhara will according to reports be dry.

The principal water holes existant will run as it were in two holes approx. North and South.

(1) DENLI-BOGOVIL-DEKAGIN-DULLI-A SUMADIRI-MEREBALI-MACALLA and KUFMEBODDO.

(2) GARBAHARI-WAPSHAKABAR-JUBBEH-WAPINTEN-KUPA-TARTEN and BAR.

Also water near LUCH at MADOWACIA and SALEBUY.

The leading man on the enemy's side appears to be Shireh Jama (Fer Ahmed Wed); his instructions are, according to report, to remain round MACALLA and attack when we move out in that direction from Garbahari.

I understand he has been sending envoys to a tribe called the Techala in Italian Somaliland to join them

In the event of his being defeated; there has been a lot of talk too, of their going to Abyssinian territory but the most reliable Agents seem to think they will not go there. A report has reached here too, of the presence of 1000 Abyssinians soldiers at DOLO which should tend to keep these Marchan away from the E. DAWA. The strength of the Bon Marchan is somewhat difficult to gauge but I think they number about 600 men, and 40 rifles.

The Sarah Ogas number about 400 men and 30 rifles. From these numbers it would appear that the total numbers of all the Marchan, Sarah Ogas, Bon Marchan and Merille, included is approximately 3000 fighting men, 1000 rifles and 100 ponies.

SCOUTS

I am sending out Illidloes daily to report any change in the enemy's movements and will inform you immediately on hearing of any change in their dispositions.

I attach a return, for your information, of the amount of stores at present in GERBE HARRI, and the number of men in the Boma getting rations.

(I) The dispositions of the Marchan are at present, according to reports, as follows:-

Per Tullah. Still at DENLI but moving their stock to APINWEN DUB neighbourhood as there is not sufficient water for stock at DENLI.

Per Ahmed Ved & Alidery.

Living mostly at KUFMEBODOGO and ADUGUSA (just N.W. of BURGENUD) and are watering their stock at ABUMADIRE & HUMBALI.

Per Hassan

Living close to MACALLA & HUMBALI.

The Bon Marchan

Have not yet obeyed the Government order to move away from the hostile Marchan; they are, at present, living near BURGEUD-DAELI ADUGUSA-ELMAU-HUMBLE TUR, they do not, however, appear to wish to fight against the Government.

Ibrahim Burji-Uawa Samma section came in here yesterday and said he would endeavour to get his men to move E. of the line CHIRBA HAFRI ELMAU. I pointed out to him that we would not hold ourselves responsible for the lives of any Marchan if they persisted in living amongst the hostile Marchan.

Marchan O.S.

On 16th inst. I sent YISHAKABE & JUMBI to

on commandant on the 11th instant. Plotting against us.

I think they are plotting against us; when

we go out- even from what he told me himself I informed that he had been plotting. He also appeared very anxious that we should return the 30 captured camels belonging to the Merille as he said the owner was faithful to the Government; this is untrue.

- (2) I received a letter from Corporal Hassan Ihsa, Armed Scye, yesterday. He is at Lugh buying camels and told me that he had heard a great many Somalis saying that Sarah Gaaf was plotting against the Government.
- (3) I find it somewhat difficult to get scouts at present; those I had do not seem inclined to do any more work at present, for the reason, I believe, that they imagine we are not going to take any further action against the Marehan. I think, however, that when we show signs of starting out they will come forward again.
- (4) Water is, according to report, always plentiful at MACALLA- MACALLA water is about 1 mile to the S.E. of HUMBALI Hill and about 18 hours from here for Camel transport, 6 hours to ABUMADIRE and 6 hours from there to MACALLA via HUMBALI Camp. The water at MACALLA is got by digging from 2 to 4 feet deep.
- (5) Captain Carew has cut about 3½ miles of the GEERA-HAFRI-ABUMADIRE road to-day and it is hoped that another 2½ miles will be finished to-morrow; the road cutting party was not molested to-day- I have sent out a man to MACALLA to-day to find out what effect the road cutting has had on the Marehan.

I beg to report the following:

- (1) The Marchan who opposed you at BOGORI on the 21st were Per. Ulich and some Per Hassan, numbers unknown. Reports as to the number killed vary from fifteen (15) to 50.
- (2) The hostile Marchan round MACALLA are now much alarmed and started moving away on the 5th. Their dispositions yesterday were as follows:-

Ahmed Wed & Elidera. Have fled, some towards the River DAUA, while others are at GUBBUT & DARG, at present they are very much scattered.

Per Hassan. Some at MACALLA, and some at DAUJI, their intention is to join with the Per. Ulich at BOGORI and to attack any safaris on the GERBA HAFI-SETENI road.

Friends

Bon Marchan. Are, I hear, moving Eastwards, away from the hostile Marchan.

Arab Ogas. are at LUBSI, WASHAKABAR, others water-ing on the River Juba and some of 'Arab Goat's section watering at APTEEN-DUF.

I have obtained reliable information that 'Arab Goat's section (the ibaha Mijertain) is prepared to go against us as soon as operations start; I do not think it likely that they will openly revolt.

Deria Chacul & Gulhad Aliyah are still loyal to the Government.

- (3) Six cattle astrayed in here on the 23rd inst. they belong to a man called Hible, an escaped 'Arab Ogas prisoner, so I am now returning them to the owner.

- (4) I think it most likely that when the Marehan realise that you have returned to SEYILLI, they will return to MACALLA.
- (5) There have been fresh tracks round the Boma the last two ~~minimum~~ nights but so far the enemy have not fired at us. On the 25th instant two camels, belonging to one of my illaloes, were taken by Marehan.
- (6) I have received a letter from the Italian at Lugh informing me that the Marehan raided their subjects near Lugh on 21st instant and captured 100 cattle. I received information this morning that these cattle have all been returned as the Ahmed Wed, who captured them, could not agree as to whom they belonged.
- (7) There is no water at ABUADIP now. I have also been informed there is water at DEGAL, 5 miles N.E. of BOGOFT and in the same river bed; water is plentiful at Degal now.
- (8) Sent by runner (Abdi Aden) at 12 noon.

- (1) I have to report that the Fer Fullah were at Tarnwen Hussad on the 5th inst. and also a few Fer Hassan; their stock is being watered in the R. Juba.
- (2) The Fer Hassan are, for the most part at DAHLI, with some at MACALLA & HUMBALI; from the latest reports I have gathered that it is unlikely the Fer Hassan will join the Fer Fullah in any numbers to attack a safari coming out here.
- (3) The Ahmed Ved and Eliders are at MACALLA, HUMBALI, LIBAHILLO, KUFHESODDO; and some at YEHASSO (on the R. Juba). I have also obtained information that there are 5 Marrias at ABUMADIDI but I am sending out two armed scyces to-night to corroborate this.

I have obtained no information of the presence of any Ahmed Ved near TARNWEN.

- (4) The Bejodia have lately been raided by the Abyssinians and it has been reported to me that they wish to join the hostile Marchan.
- (5) I have received information that the Fer Fullah have lately sent stock to WEB & MAFAMADOO in Abyssinia and exchanged same for rifles & ammunition. The other hostile Marchan are still bringing rifles and ammunition from the Sheikh Aoul, Shir Mogi, Cassar Codu who live at YEHASSO and who buy these rifles from the Jemaa in Italian country.

- (6) The Marchan still believe that we will not move against them. They appear to be afraid of going to Abyssinia or even to Italian country; as I am informed that there are Abyssinian troops close to the DAWA and R. Juba is also being patrolled by the Italians, who have detachments at HAFEILEH & CODOBOI.

As far as I can gather the dispositions of the Marchan on the 11th (eleventh) inst. were as follows:-

- (1) The Ahmed Med- Per Hassan and Elidera are mostly living round MACALLA, HUMBALI & DUILI.

As a result of the raid at WANGI on the 9th inst. more Ahmed Med and Elidera stock has gone to the R. Juba and is scattered between WUPOLEN & YUASSO. There is still much stock at DUILI and round HUMBALI & MACALLA.

- (2) A baraza was held at HUMBALI on the 8th, one of my dailaces was at it and states that the Perullah and some Per Hassan are to stop any safari coming from Serenli while the remainder are to attack the picquets at GAFIA HARRI.

- (3) The Sarah Ogas and Malim Iss are at HELOMIRRA - JUBREH WARSHAKABAR & BUDJULU and are watering in the river; there are also some Sarah Ogas at GEDEBIELE.

The Perullah are mostly at CARDEBEK-KUKUMI & DUMASA their strength, together with some Per Hassan living with them is about 400.

From what I have heard, the Sarah Ogas are not willing to revolt openly against us till they have seen the result of the first fight.

- (4) The Bon Marchan, Mama Samma section are round BURSAM, so far they have not shewn any inclination to fight against us.

- (5) Captain Carew with 140 men is proceeding towards AHUMADIRE to-morrow to make a reconnaissance in force.

- (6) Five syces and askaris proceeded to DUILI last night and killed about 15 camels. I have not yet heard what effect this has had but it is hoped that their raid, the capture of stock at WANGI, together with the reconnaissance to be made to-morrow may lead the Marchan to imagine we are going to make for MACALLA.

- (7) The Perullah, if beaten, are to proceed N. along

the river Juba and the Ahmed Wed and Elidera hope to join them somewhere ~~near~~ near LUGH. The Rer Hassan will, if the Rer Tullah are defeated, drive their stock to the River Dawa.

- (8) It is most difficult to get the reliable information here as I have to rely almost entirely on Sarah Ogas. However, as far as I can gather, all the remaining sections want to see how the Rer Tullah fare first before they commit themselves.
- (9) I have illaloes near HELIGERARA to report any movement Northwards on the part of the Rer Tullah. I think it quite likely, however, that I will not get any useful information till it is too late.

GERBA HARRI 13-2-14.

Gerba Harri Camp.

This morning at 7.30 a.m. the signalling picquet of I.N.C.O. and 5 men was ambushed as it was proceeding to Signal Hill, by a large party of Somalis. No 25 Pte Fasise B Coy 1st K.A.R. was killed and No 168 Pte Sialre B Coy 1st K.A.R. was wounded. The picquet retired to the Boma and I at once, on hearing the shots, started out with 25 men and a maxim, shots were exchanged for about 15 minutes as I advanced and then the enemy retired, I did not feel justified in following them up far as I did not wish to get cut off from the Boma and did not at the time know how many Somalis were against me.

I saw tracks of blood where two of the enemy had been hit but do not know what casualties they sustained.

A Sarah Ogas, who had been captured by the enemy and who afterwards ran away from them, states that they were about 60 of them, 45 of which were armed with rifles, they were principally Fer Hassan from Dubli to which place they retired.

I gave out my orders re picquets to Sgt. William to-day which were that 30 men in all were to form the grazing guard and signalling picquet, the whole to go together to the foot of the signalling hill, the cattle and camels to graze there and an N.C.O. & 5 men to go to the top of the hill. The N.C.O. in charge of the signallers (L/Cpl Chirumba B Coy 1st K.A.R.) went off by himself before the 30 men of the grazing guard had left the Boma. Cpl Henry Miniamwe-i who was in

charge of the rear guard took no steps to ascertain why the signalling party had not fallen in with the rear guard.

The enemy captured one rifle, 1 bayonet and 100 rounds of ammunition belonging to the man killed.

I have obtained the following information.

- (1) The whole of the Rer Tullah, together with 200 Per Hassan are near GERDEBILLE and BURDUBO and are watering in the river. The bush round GERDEBILLE is reported to be very thick. Total number of Rer Tullah & Per Hassan is 500.
- (2) The Sarah Ogas are living at NAPSHAKABAT, HELOMERAPA and BUSSEL.
- (3) The Bon Marchan are living at BUSSEL and are scattered about along the river as far North as KALIBASI.
- (4) Most of the Ahmed Wed are living near KALIBASI & YEHASSO Number about 200.
- (5) The main body of the Per Hassan, the Eliders and some Ahmed Wed are living at DUBLI, MACALLA & HUMBALI;
Strength - 600 Per Hassan.
150 Eliders.
100 Ahmed Wed.
- (6) The present plans of the Rer Tullah are, to wait in the thick bush round GERDEBILLE until attacked. If beaten, they hope to be able to return N. along the River Juba.
- (7) The Ahmed Wed are making plans to attack the Boma at GERRA HAPPI, their chief object being to get our stock.
- (8) As far as I can gather it is not the intention of the Marchan at DUBLI-MACALLA & HUMBALI to join the Rer Tullah at GERDEBILLE.
- (9) No baggage camels of the Sarah Ogas have been brought in yet, but I hear that Peria Chacul is having 20 sent in.
- (10) The Bon Marchan still maintain a friendly attitude towards us but do not seem prepared to help.
- (II) The Sarah Ogas occasionally come into the Boma; I think, chiefly to report our movements to the enemy.

I find it increasingly difficult to get any reliable information from them.

(LB) Ber Hassan Illalces have been coming here for the last three nights but have not fired into the Boma so far.
