I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as either an Assistant District Commr. in the East or in Uganda, or as a 5th Grade Resident in Nyasaland, with salary at the rate of £250 fixed in the East or £250 rising by annual increments of £10 to £350 in Uganda. Quantities of leave of absence, but not of salary, similar to those given elsewhere in his Majesty's service. A memorandum showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate is enclosed herewith, but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. A copy of the regulations as to pensions is also enclosed, and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

3. You are also to understand that you will be available for employment in any appointment which the Governor of the Protectorate may direct, and it will be within his discretion to recommend to the Secretary of State your transfer to another branch of the administration if he sees fit to do so.

4. You would be required, before proceeding to East Africa, to undergo a course of instruction, commencing on the 19th of September in the following subjects:—Tropical Hygiene and Sanitation; Criminal Law, Evidence and Procedure; Elementary Accounting; Tropical Economic Products; Elementary Surveying; Colonial System of Accounts. Particulars of the course are given in the enclosed memorandum, and I am to direct your attention especially to the condition mentioned in paragraph 5.

5. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical officers of this Department, whose names are given on the ^{enclosed} letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be detached and left with him; and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea. He will send his report direct to this Department.

6. I am to request that you will state whether you accept the offer, and if so, that you will furnish me with the name and permanent address of a relative (stating his or her relationship to you) for reference in case of emergency.
