You would, like the permanent Medical Officers, be under the orders of the Governor and the superior officers of the Medical

Department. The duties of the appointment

would be those ordinarily performed by a

Medical Officer, but you would understand

that you may be called upon for service

in connection with the diseases which are

being taken to prevent the spread of sickness

amongst the natives of the country.

Temporary appointments of general conditions

attached to establishments in South Africa

are not made, but you will of

cours be subject to the regulations which

hereinafter are mentioned or given in the

annexed to this Memorandum, except in so far

as the pensions regulations is also enclosed.

But those regulations will apply to you

only

only if you are subsequently placed on the permanent and pensionable staff of the Protectorate.

If you are prepared to accept this offer, you should present yourself, without delay, for examination to one of the Medical Officers whose names are given on the enclosed letter. The letter should be left with the medical officer who will send his report direct to this department. You will be required to pay him his professional fee of one guinea.

It is customary to require Medical Officers to go through a course of instruction either at the London or the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine prior to their departure from this country. As, however, it would be impossible for you to take up your appointment until January next if you were to wait for the next course of instruction, Lord Cromer is willing to allow you to defer this course until

until your first leave of absence. In this connection I would like your attention to

Section 2. Regulations for the employ-

ment of officers appointed to the East Africa,

Uganda and Somaliland Protectorates.

It is my desire that you do as soon as possible

accept my offer and if you do accept it

and if so, when you should be prepared to

leave England for the Union-Africa steamer

which is due to steam from Southampton on the

1st day of November and to arrive at

Aden on the 10th of December. It is very

desirable that you should take up your duties

as soon as can be arranged, and I hope you

trust that you will be able to travel by the

steamer arranged.

In the event of your accepting this

offer, you should furnish me with an address

to which communications intended for your

relatives or friends can be sent in your

absence.
