

Sir,

I am in receipt of your favour of the 18th instant, No. 21965/1911, and am very much obliged to you for the full and interesting report on the question of Cotton-growing in Jubaland.

2. As you are aware, matters in connection with ~~Venitum~~ this country have been delayed owing to the very unfortunate illness of Sir Julius Wernher, and as there does not seem any immediate prospect of his recovery sufficiently to attend to business, I am sending a copy of your letter together with the other papers on to Mr. Eckstein. I have also suggested that the whole matter should be put before the Sudan Manager, Mr. D. P. MacGillivray, who has had very considerable business experience of Cotton-growing under irrigation in the Sudan.

3. Unfortunately too, I had arranged to go to Norway immediately; but shall be back again by the 1st of September next, when I hope to put matters in train for a full investigation of the possibilities respecting Cotton-growing on the Juba river.
