Sir,

I beg to enclose a short newspaper correspondence which will fully and concisely explain the complaint I have against the authorities in British East Africa. Hoping you will give me the necessary help, that a similar stand is always given to a British citizen as against a wrong doer.

Conditions as explained in my letter of the 1st April last to the Crown Advocate compelled me to employ Somalis in stock trading and several of the latter have recently told me that if the British Resident at Bebera was instructed to tell the absconders tribes that Rs 1700 had to be forthcoming, this sum would be produced at once.

In my letter of the 1st April last to the Crown Advocate I mentioned the fact that I intended to bring my complaint to the notice of the Colonial Secretary through a Colleague of mine who uses his solicitor. This was quite true as I thought at the time of writing that Lord Crewe was Colonial Secretary.

with great deference Sir I would ask you to investigate my Complaint against the authorities responsible for my loss. It is a case that affects the whole community and which has excited many sympathetic expressions on my behalf.

I disliked intensely writing to the "East African Standard" but it was the only method open to me in trying to get something practical done whilst there was a chance of arresting the absconder His Excellency The Governor had failed to see the Crown Advocate as promised and the latter on his own written admission wasted a valuable 10 days before investigating the case.

I also have taken the liberty of enclosing a leading article of the "East African Standard" newspaper, on my case.
