I think the Administration might permit us to lay our rails on one side of the present Fort Hall Road without detriment. It is clear that we must establish a railway connection with the Forest if as seems evident from the report to His Excellency, the Tana River is worthless for the purpose of transportation.

I think that the construction by us of a serviceable Railway to some point near Embu should be a part of the concession
