Reply that Mr Harcourt is not prepared to consider proposals which involve the grant of a monopoly of the erection of grain silos in the Protectorate or a guarantee by the Govt of the quantity of grain to be delivered to the silos, but that if he is prepared to amend his proposals by the omission of these requirements, the S. of S. will ask the Govt for his opinion on the amended proposals.
