Referring to my call upon you, I beg to propose that as the two schemes are so closely interdependent of each other, and must to a large extent be designed so that each section is thoroughly suitable for the other section, it would seem to be the most natural and economical course to propose to have the designing and carrying out of the whole of the work in the hands of one firm of engineers and contractors.

Messrs. ~~Macmillan & Company~~, who are the principal specialists in the construction of quay walls, have also experience in large engineering works, and are prepared to design a quay wall and submit the same to tender by them. (The Government).

By doing so, it will be possible to avoid any possibility of trouble arising through divided contracts overlapping.
