I have noted the information sent.

I am afraid they are not taking much trouble over this matter. I attach a list (marked A) of local agents made during 1910 and 1911 and notified to us from time to time. You will see from our de patch on Trac/37026 /09 that we asked for a form in the case of every locally engaged European subordinate. I have not received a single form in respect of the agents shown on the list.

Again on looking through the Blue Book I find a large number of subordinates of whom I have not recd ptre who from their names at any rate appear to be Europeans. Attached is a list marked B of such subordinates picked out casually as far as the letter H.

It does not look as if there is much in the the statement "so far as can be ascertained". If the statistics are to be of any use they simply must comply with

Sir, I have recd your desp. no. 29 of the 13th January respecting the vital statistics of European subordinates.

2. With reference to the statement in para 2 of that desp. that, so far as can be ascertained every locally engaged European subordinate in the service has filled in a form. I have, to call your attention to the fact that I have not received a single form of particulars in respect of the local appts shown on the enclosed list (marked A), which you have notified to me from time to time. I should be glad of your explanation of this point.

3. On looking through the alphabetical list of staff in the Blue Book I find there is a large number of subordinates who from their names appear to be Europeans, of whom also I have not received particulars. I enclose a list (marked B) of those casually picked out as far as the letter H. I should be glad to learn whether they are Europeans and if so why I have not been supplied with forms of pfrs in their cases.
