I have the honour to refer to your Confidential despatch of the 27th of November 1911 with regard to the observance of the provisions of the Official Secrets Act, 1911 and to offer the following remarks thereon:-

2. I would suggest that an Officers' Mess should be included in the list of "prohibited places" in Section 3 of the Act.

3. With reference to the second paragraph of your despatch under reply, I consider that, in view of the number of Goanese employed in Government Service, and of the fact that a considerable percentage of the residents of this country are of foreign extraction, it would not be inadvisable to make the Act generally enforceable, and I am further of the opinion that a copy thereof should be posted in all Government offices and also published in the Official Gazette and in all local newspapers.






