With reference to your despatch No. 541 of the 5th of September ¹⁹¹² last, I have the honour to lay before you the following facts relating to the provision made for the Nairobi Water Supply:-

(1) The total estimated cost of the scheme was £15,696 and was spread over two years as follows:-

(2) There is thus a balance of £5,108 which will remain unexpended at the close of this financial year, as the Railway Department, who are carrying out the work, report that, owing to having to import on England for material before they can proceed with the extension, there will be no further expenditure during the current financial

financial year.

(2) When the estimates for 1912-13 were framed in November last it was anticipated that the provision made, £8,275 would be expended, and therefore no sum was inserted for the work in 1912-13.

(4) The sum of £5,108 however will be required in 1912-13 to complete the necessary extensions to the distribution system to: (1) Sixth Avenue, and vicinity, (2) The Native Location, and (3) Parklands.


(5) Under these circumstances a Special Warrant must issue early in the financial year to be subsequently inserted in a Supplementary Estimate; but I think it advisable to lay the facts before you now in order that the position may be understood.

(6) I would mention that in taking any savings into consideration to cover increased expenditure on certain items of the current year's estimates this amount of £5,108 was not included, so that the whole amount may be considered as earmarked.
