

Sir,

I have the honour to bring to your notice a point which has arisen in connection with the attendance of officers, whilst on leave, at one or other of the various Courses of Instruction.

2. It sometimes becomes necessary for an officer to apply for an extension of leave in order to complete a particular course. This is usually granted without pay and consequently the additional time so spent does not count towards the officer's dispensable service.

3. Instruction given at these courses is considered by the benefit of the service, I hope it would be suggested that in such cases an officer may be granted pay until the completion of the course for which he has obtained an extension of leave.

4. A specific instance has arisen in the case of Mr. J.H. Osborne, District Commissioner, Macraes, who has submitted a claim for pay during his 14 days' extension while attending the course in Elementary Surveying of September and October last.

I have had under my considera-

tion your despatch No. 160 of the 5th of March relative to the question of the grant of pay in the case of extensions of leave to complete courses of instruction.

2. As a general rule I do not consider it desirable that extensions of leave should be granted in connection with courses of instruction. But, when in the cases in which it may be deemed found to be necessary to grant an extension of leave is granted in order to enable an officer to complete a course, I have decided that it shall be granted
