usually earned by officers who leave this
country to serve in the Colonies and Protec-
torates. While a gratuity, which is part
of the new scheme, might be useful in some
cases, I have come to the conclusion that
in the majority of cases it was better
to adhere to the higher rates of pension
which are obtainable under the present system.
