I have to thank the receipt of your despatch No 10331/2 of the 17th of April.

I have to inform you that, on the subject of the understanding that my departure from the country was necessarily sanctioned by the Government, I have been approached in regard to the new regulations of the Forests, as from the date of first arrival in the East, instead of from the 1st of April 1901.

I have
