MEMORANDUM OF CONDITIONS OF SERVICE FOR  
CONDITIONS OF SERVICE FOR THE ACCOUNTANT AT THE  
GENERAL POST OFFICE, KAROBI.

Salary - £150 per annum rising by annual increments of £8 to £200 per annum. The Officer appointed will also be provided either with free quarters, partly furnished, or an allowance in lieu thereof at the option of the Government. If quarters are given they will be free of rent, but not of rates or similar outgoings. If an allowance in lieu be granted this may be associated with a requirement to reside in a particular house or neighbourhood.

2. The candidate appointed should be between 26 and 35 years of age and should be selected from applicants qualified in accounting work and preferably from Officers of the rank of "First Class Female Clerk" of the accounting branches of the British Post Office.

3. The selected candidate should have a working knowledge of the German language and, if possible, an all-round acquaintance with the different branches of accounting work of the Imperial Post Office.

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5. The Officer appointed will be required  
to give instruction in accounting work to a small  
staff of girls, mostly fresh from school, recruited  
from the daughters or relatives of local settlers,  
and in addition to the work in  
which they're accounting for the revenue from of  
the establishment.

6. The appointment will in the first instance  
be for three years only but may be made permanent  
should the continued employment of a female account-  
ing staff be considered advisable.

7. free first class passage from London  
to Nairobi will be granted to the Officer proceeding  
to take up the appointment. A return passage will  
also be provided when proceeding on leave after  
10 months' service.

8. Leave will be granted at the end of 30  
months' service. This leave would amount to  
either over three months one full pay in the case of  
an Officer whose services were being terminated.

In the event of the Officer returning to the  
entertainment of duty before his regular leave, or if  
he apprehensively shall my wish be given, that  
such leave may be only one month.

9. Some gratuity will be given to the  
Officer on leaving the service.

or may of the agreement, for any cause other than death, the committee appointed will be responsible for service on every occasion of such a period as may be proposed by the Governor of the Protectorate, it being understood afterwards that a sum of money will be paid to the period served, provided that a month's notice of the intention to leave is given.

10. In case of marriage, a gratuity will be granted viz:- one months pay for each year of service on condition that two years service in the Protectorate has been completed and six years in the aggregate of Protectorate and Imperial pensionable service. In no case may such gratuity exceed 12 months salary.

11. Pensions will be granted in accordance with the rules laid down under the Superannuation Act of 1892.

12. If at the end of 3 months agreement, together with such leave as shall be due it is decided not to continue the services of the Officer nominated, such Officer will be allowed, subject to proof of sufficient mental and physical fitness, a sum of money for his removal expenses and subsistence during the time of his stay in the Protectorate.
