Sir,

I have the honour to bring the following case to your notice for favourable consideration.

2. The Hon. W.R. Wynham originally took up a property at Donyo Sabuk consisting of 6,983 acres for the purpose of a Game Reserve on which he erected a shooting box. Later on he obtained Government consent to transfer the property as a gift and without any conditions to Mr. J.M. Elkington, who now asks for permission to transfer it to Mr. McMillan. The latter holds with his wife a total of 28,268 acres and the question remains as to whether he should be allowed to obtain this further grant by transfer.

3. I have enquired whether Mr. McMillan would be prepared to accept a special condition as regards future development viz: that the land be developed to the extent of twenty times the rent and I am informed that no objection will be raised to this.

4. In these circumstances therefore I recommend
