In reply to your letter of the 17th inst. regarding an assistant Conservator of Forests for the East African Protect-orate, I beg to say that the only candidate who has taken the Diploma in Forestry, and also had some experience of tropical silviculture, would be Mr. V.G. Morgan, Deputy Conservator of Forests in the Central Provinces of India, at present stationed at Chhindwara. Mr. Morgan passed out first of his year at Coopers Hill College, and joined the Indian Forest Department in 1902. He cannot stand the Indian climate and I am inclined to think that he might accept this post in East Africa.

Failing Mr. Morgan's acceptance, or your unwillingness to consider him, I should like to bring to the notice of the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the name of Mr. D.K.S. Grant. That Gentleman has gone through a three years course at this University, including 7 months practical work in Continental forests.
