With reference to those portions of the chclosures to your despatch No.175 of March 29th and telegram of April 22nd which deal with the Coast Land Settlement, I have the honour to submit the following report on the reasons which render an increase of expenditure under this heading necessary.

2. Sir Percy Gircuard pointed out the great necessity for continuing the arrangements in con--naction with the Coast Land Settlement Scheme in his despatch No. 176 of April 13th 1911. Unfortulnately the progress in the work which was Poreshadowed in that despatch has not been effected owing to the shortage of surveyors, computers and draughtsmen. That the work of the survey had already fallen greatly in arrears was noticeable in July last and Sir Percy Girouard reported in his telegram No.156 of the 21st of that month # that owing to several vacancies not having been filled no certificates of title could be issued as the plans which had to be attached to the deeds could not be drawn. Had there been a sufficient
