If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificate come well with it, by not sent in original, the copies must be duly attested.

Head 1 of Paper—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 450.)

Head 2—State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, viz., Superannuation Compensation, Compassionate Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Persons obtaining an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, this should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

Head 3—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added before or after the number of years and months, and the causes, dates, and circumstances of the break or breaks should be stated under heading 2.

Head 4—If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the sum Salary, or in the class from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual annual rate of Salary or Wages to that date should be inserted preceded by the word "actual." In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average." But if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

Head 7—A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value for the 36 months immediately preceding retirement of such Retirement (exclusive of salary or wages) which is claimed to be included in the calculation of the Pension or Gratuity.

Whereas the value of a House or House Allowance, as ascertained, exceeds one-sixth of the retirement Allowance, which is claimed for Pension purposes, it is to be reduced to one-sixth of that amount, and it shall not be a part of the whole.

Persons who have been in receipt of a Pension for six months will be taken into account as Pensioners with regular salary, at the actual average of the salary for the 36 months next preceding the date of retirement. These persons are to be included by the word "actual" in the gross amount of Pension or Gratuity. Persons who are not Pensioners may have had to pay from their own resources for such salary, the service for which it was paid, and by the word "average." No deduction, however, from the Pension should be made in respect of such a Pensioner's service from Public Funds, for the due discharge of these duties, but the actual Salary or wages, as stated in the Paper of Particulars when forwarded to the Office, should be accompanied by formal Declarations from the retiring Officer, showing the amount received by them for Fees, and the amount defrayed as above for their Expenses. Accounts for the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Applicant to arrange to have the necessary statements of the amount of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries, if from the Year when the salary was received, circumstances be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of one-third of the Salary, and Fees will not in any case be allowed towards the Pension purpose during any period in which the whole time of the Officer receiving them was not given to the Public Service.

Head 5—In case of any injury of the limbs, or of the eyes, or of the ordinary organs for retirement, a Medical certificate is to be furnished showing that the disability is permanent, and that such disability is likely to be permanent.

In case of long years' service or more, the Certificate should be signed by the Officer, who is at least ten months of the service, by a retired Officer or the Governor.

Head 6—As to "broken" service, see Head 3. If the Applicant has any "broken" service, whether or not, during the "average" service, the details must be fully given, with a statement of the nature of the "broken" service, and with the permanent Civil Service of the Colony.

Head 11—If in special circumstances, the Applicant is a member of any "private practice" without receiving his share.

Head 14—If the Applicant is a member of any "private practice" during the "average" service, the details must be fully given, with a statement of the nature of the "broken" service, and with the permanent Civil Service of the Colony.

Head 10—The length of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average of service is given, it is to be explained, whether by months, or by years, and to be explained.
