## Instructions referred to on page 1.

If this Paper of Particulars and the Certificates annexed with it, or not sent in original, the copies  
must be duly attested.

**Head 1 of Paper.**—In the case of an Officer serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be added whether he is a native of that Coast. (Colonial Regulations, § 400.)

**Head 2.**—State the description of Allowance for which the Appointee is recommended, viz., Superannuation Compensation, Compensation Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Persons claiming an addition to their Pensions in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, this should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

**Head 3.**—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be added before or after the statement of years and months, and the cause, dates, and circumstances of the break or breaks should be stated under heading 9.

**Head 4.**—If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the same Salary, or in the class from which he retires, for the 60 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the annual average rate of Salary or Wages by that date should be inserted, preceded by the word "to the". In other cases the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for the 60 months next preceding the date of retirement should be inserted, preceded by the word "average", but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

**Head 5.**—A separate statement should be inserted of the average Annual Value, for the 60 months immediately preceding retirement, of each Extra-Basic allowance of salary or wages which is claimed to be included in the calculation of the Person's gratuity.

Whenever the value of a Monthly Bonus Allowance, so far as it relates to the Extra-Basic Allowances, exceeds one-half of the amount of such Extra-Basic Allowances, it will be reduced to one-half of that amount, & then it shall not be included in the average.

The amount of Extra-Basic Allowances for his service will be taken into account in "Pension purposes", with regard to him, at the annual average of the amount of all the 60 months next preceding the Officers retirement. These payments are to be deducted by the Retiring Officer from the amount of Extra-Basic Allowances, the cost of which may have had to be borne by his own Paying Master during the service for which he was remunerated by Pay. No deduction, however, from this sum should be made if the Retiring Officer receives payment from Public Funds, for the due discharge of these duties. The Extra-Basic Salary is to be stated in papers of "Particulars" when forwarded to the Colonial Office, and these papers should be accompanied by formal Declarations from the Retiring Officer concerning the amount received by them for their time, and the amount defraged as above for these services. As soon as these papers are ready, they should be forwarded to the Colonial Office, and the amount defraged as above for these services, should be clearly and distinctly provided for the remittance. It will be the duty of the Retiring Officer to make a full and clear account of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Extra-Basic Allowances, if Pay, the Extra-Basic Allowances will be allowed to count for Pension purposes to the extent of one-half. That is, a quarter of the Salaries, and Pay will count in any one half-year period for pension purposes, during any period in which the whole time of the Officers serving them was not given by the Public Service.

**Head 6.**—In case of disability if the Appointee before the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical certificate is to be forwarded showing that he is disabled by infirmity of mind, & by the following the date of his retirement, who has authority to be present at the examination.

In case of ten years' service or more, this Certificate should be signed by the Medical Officer giving at least one month's notice, to the Retiring Officer or the Agent.

**Head 7.**—As to "broken" service, see Head 3.

If the Appointee has been "acting" whether or not during the "acting" service

in this paper be fully given, with a statement and signature with the permanent Civil Service.

**Head 8.**—In case of circumstances which render it necessary to have a private practice, without leaving his place of residence.

**Head 9.**—If the Appointee has been "acting" during the last five years of his service.

**Head 10.**—Length of service and other particular of the compensation to be given. What an average of salary, &c, is likely to make of advertising it, whether by months, &c, is to be explained.
