apparently no authenticated copies have been sent home. To deal with the note under these circumstances would simply necessitate 2 Africa in a stock exchange way. There is no reason for either mission or the instructions which have been in force since 1902. Provision will be made for a full report by the local (throughout) and the transmission of authenticated copies - see paras 8 & 23.

Instructions from the funds are, and remain on the same basis. The instructions have been 1870-1902 which have 2 authenticated copies of the original copy of the original copy of Africa. The instructions have been practically identical as 2 copies of the original copy.

[I am sorry to remember that I am considering the similarity between the instructions of the various provisions which have been sent to the other parts in Africa. As soon as the necessary orders are passed I will propose to amend and re-issue the 1902 instructions so as to contain into them a clause based on Col Reg. 199 provisions for a report by the local officer who drafted the instructions to the Governor. In doing so I am providing for a similar clause in case of consultations, also similar letters or arrangements copies in case of adaptations of these regulations, and a clause based on Col Reg. 261-22 provisions for 2 copies of plain copies for Co and plain copies for all or some of the legislations mentioned in Col Reg. 261 and also the security of stamp paper.]
