Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 13616/1907 of the 25th of April last and subsequent correspondence respecting the thirteen police constables required for service in the Nairobi Police, I have the honour to enclose herewith a list of names of volunteers which we have received through the Chief Constables at Liverpool and Manchester and the commissioner of the London Metropolitan Police.

2. We are expecting to receive further names from these three officials, and on doing so we will communicate with you again.

3. The Chief Constable at Manchester desires that the men who have volunteered from the Force of that city may be communicated with direct in the event of any communication being necessary, and their addresses are accordingly included in the list.

4. I also enclose a copy of a letter which we have received from the Chief Constable at Manchester regarding the suggestion that the selected candidates should be seconded from their respective forces for the period of service in East Africa.

Conditions of Service.

Age and health.

1. Candidates should be over 24 years of age, unmarried, and certified by a ^{Medical Officer} ~~Medical Officer~~ as fit for service in the East Africa Protectorate, ~~otherwise their application can not be entertained.~~
It is desirable that ~~which~~ they should be able to ride.
~~The Surgeon's fee will be paid by this Department.~~

Period of service.

2. The period of service will be for three years from the date of arrival in the Protectorate, and selected candidates will be required to enter into an Agreement ^{with the CA for the Col. on} ~~with the CA for the Col. on~~ the following conditions, ~~Inspection of the East Africa Protectorate, subject to the conditions and regulations.~~

Leave.

Subject to the concurrence of the Commandant,
3. On the satisfactory termination of his employment, a Constable may be granted 3 months leave of absence with half salary if he does not renew his agreement.

If re-engaging for further service he may be granted leave according to the rates in force at the time for European subordinates in the Protectorate.

4. 3rd class Railway fare from place of residence to the port of embarkation and a 3rd class ocean passage to the Protectorate will be given to selected

affected candidates, and similar passages none on satisfactory termination of employment or in the event of their being invalided out of the Protectorate by reason of ill-health other than that due to personal misconduct.

In the event of their services being terminated for any other cause than those indicated, Contractors will be liable to such provisions of the Line-Contract Agreements mentioned in section 2 as may be applicable to the circumstances.

pay and allowances.

5. The Syst will receive ^{the necessary} ~~at the rate of~~ ^{contingents} ~~at the fixed~~ rate of ~~£120 p a~~ ^{with} free quarters or an allowance thereof.

Outfit.

Free outfit on the usual scale will be provided here, and Khaki uniform on arrival in the Protectorate.
