I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No 45309/06 dated the 15th March last and respectfully ranusot is be allowed to say that I trust my despatch No.16 -dated the 25th July .906 did not convey to the Earl of Elginthat I desired to claim any personal merit for any saving to the Protopiorates .- In examining progress in such a matter as this the only comparison possible was between the past, as represented by the conduct of affairs before the establishment of this effime and the present as represented by the conduct of the same by this office. The "savings" quoted in my despatch No.16 dated the 25th July 1906 were not offested before 1899 and are now .-Hir Lordship's orinion that the same might equally have been affeeted without the aid of this office is incontrevertible but in considering what is the cost of the maintenance of this offite to Government, may I be allowed to suggest that consideration should also be given to what the cost would have been had the services of an Agent or private firms been requisitioned and their commission for such services been met .-
