Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No. 21334 dated the 28th June and to tender my thanks to the Earl of Elgin for his kind sanction to a part of the savings on Mr. Jeaffreson's salary being expended on providing additional remuneration for my clerks who have had additional work actually thrown upon them owing to Mr. Jeaffreson's absence.

It is only upon my Head Native Clerk, my second and my fourth Clerks that extra work has been thrown and particulars of that devolving upon each are given in a List appended.- My entire staff has worked most satisfactorily and has succeeded in carrying through the work without a mistake although it has been heavier than ever before and four contingents of Troops have passed through Bombay.- All have, it is perhaps almost superfluous to mention, had to forego their annual leave which is not cumulative.-

Mr. Jeaffreson was absent from the 24th May 1906 to the 28th March 1907, say 10 months in all, during the first three of which, I understand, he drew full pay. During the next three months three quarters pay, and during the remaining four months half pay, representing a total owing to Government of say £110.-

In view of the circumstances of the case I would, if you will allow me, draw your attention to the following allowances to the three Clerks upon whom extra work fell for the period of seven months during which Mr. Jeaffreson

son did not draw full pay, namely:

First Native Clerk. B.R.Davar, whose pay is Rs.120.- per month, an allowance of Rs.24.- per month = Rs.144.-

Second Clerk. A.Vangesh Rau, whose pay is Rs.75.- per month, an allowance of Rs.12.- per month = Rs.87.-

Fourth Clerk. N.Shankernarain Rau, whose pay is Rs.33.- per month, an allowance of Rs.10.8.- per month = Rs.73.8.-

making a total of Rs.325.8.-, or say £ 21.14.-

I am greatly obliged for the copy of the despatch addressed by His Lordship to the Commissioners of the ~~East~~ Africa, Uganda, and Somaliland Protectorates under Date of the 23rd October 1906 on the subject of Acting Allowances.

First Native Clerk, Mr. B.R. Davar.- Finally checking all payments, leave Pay, Bills Payable (i.e. drafts), Accounts, the correct issue of Indents. - Also the general supervision of the correct and regular carrying on of all details of the work of the office.-

Second Clerk, Mr. A. Mangesh Rau.- Checking the terms of Agreements of all newly engaged Employees. - Checking the details of Last Pay Certificates issued by this Office. - Drafting certain local letters. - Supervising the Agency in connection with embarkation and return of three P.W. Contingents or Ships and assisting the Officers Commanding who returned Uganda and Central Africa recently.

Fourth Clerk, Mr. N. Shankernarain Rao. - Classifying applications for employment. - Checking the Register of Acquisitions for Employees. - Arranging the dates of arrival in Bombay of newly engaged Employees, artisans etc. - arranging for their housing in Bombay when necessary, arranging their dates of departure, engaging their passages and personally supervising their embarkation when necessary.-
