TREASURY CHAMBERS,

January 1907.

SIR,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His
Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus' letter of the 1st ultime
(30/12/1906) in which the Earl of Elgin recommends that
the exemption from Customs duting of entire horses and
asses imported into the East Africa Protectorate may be
extended to include mules and geldings.

In reply I am to say that, as the Secretary of
State is aware - vide Treasury letter of the 3rd November
last (No. 18096/06) - My Lords are opposed in principle to
alterations of particular items in a Customs tariff without
consideration of the tariff as a whole, and particularly
so when - as in East Africa - that tariff has only recently
been revised.

As however the duty on mules and geldings appears
to be productive of very little revenue and to be harmful
to the development of the Protectorate, My Lords will raise
no objection to its remission.
