Sir,

In reply to Mr. Antrobus's letter (47932/1906) of the 24th instant, I am to request you to convey to the Earl of Elgin the sanction of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the undermentioned increases in the emoluments of officers of the East Africa Protectorate as from 1st April next, viz:

Mr. Bowring, Treasurer.

A personal allowance of £100 per annum

Mr. S. L. Hinde, Sub-Commissioner.

A personal allowance of £100 per annum.

Mr. D. J. Wilson, Director of Transport.

An allowance of £50 per annum (in addition to £25 per annum from Uganda) in respect of his additional work as Principal Emigration Officer.

Their Lordships' sanction as above is given subject to consideration of the Protectorate Estimates as a whole for 1907/B.

In order to secure the result which the Secretary of State and this Board have in view, viz: to limit the increase of gross expenditure to half the increase of estimated revenue, My Lords take this opportunity of reminding his Lordship that the essential element in securing this result is to scrutinize carefully all proposals from the Protectorate for increasing recurrent expenditure and
