Sir,

With reference to Mr. Barratt Cox's letter of the 14th instant (1997/1906-07), relative to a proposed proclamation for bringing the new Subsidiary Coinage into force in the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, I am directed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to transmit herewith, for the information of the Secretary of State, a copy of a report which they have received from the Deputy Master of the Mint on the subject.

I am to suggest for Lord Elgin's consideration that, in view of the circumstances referred to by Mr. Macartney, the coming into force of the Proclamation should be postponed from the 1st April to the 1st June next.

The only question which arises on the draft Proclamation now proposed is whether the date proposed, viz. the 1st April, 1907, is a suitable one. If, in order to give effect to the Proclamation, it is necessary that the subsidiary nickel-bronze and aluminium coinages now on order should be actually landed in the Protectorates I hesitate to guarantee their delivery there by that date, as we have not had sufficient trial of the cutting machine specially prepared for these coinages to guarantee a continuous rate of output. On this account I should prefer a later date, say the 1st June, 1907. Otherwise I have no remarks to make.

In reply to your letter no. 976/107, of the 29<sup>th</sup> of January, I am directed by the Earl of Elgin to request you to inform the Lord Chancellor of the Treasury that he does not consider it necessary that the publication of the new system of currency - in the last African and Indian Provinces should be postponed until the stock of nickel bronze and aluminum coins has actually been landed in the last African Province of Lord Elgin's jurisdiction.

Report had already  
been made to the  
Secretary of the last Plan  
Commission, who is now in

effed a law of abrogation.  
Mr. Bowring points out that,  
until the existing coin are  
demonetized, the old  
and the new coins will  
be legal tender currency.

and that, therefore, if  
we are anxious that the  
new coins should actually  
be in circulation when  
Relay is made it  
is very desirable that  
the alteration in the  
monetary system should be

of a financial year.  
This cannot be done without  
the old system being  
continued a few days  
from the 1<sup>st</sup> of April, but  
this is minor objection.
