TRASURY CHAMBERS

Sir,

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have had before Them Mr. Antrobus's letter (23991/1906) of the 12th December last and the enclosed correspondence on the subject of the establishment of a Provident Fund for the non-pensionable employes of the Uganda Railway.

In reply I am to request you to inform the Earl of Kigin that, having regard to the advantages which may be expected to accrue from such a Fund to the Railway service and to the fact that the local Authorities anticipate no administrative difficulty from the introduction of different rules for the Railway service and for other departments in the Protectorate, My Lords, on further consideration, are prepared to agree in principle to the establishment of such a Fund, subject to the following conditions.

1. The privilege of subscribing to the Fund shall be confined to non-pensionable employes of the Railway proper, who are in receipt of salaries of Rs. 30 per month or over.
2. On the establishment of the Fund, the bonus of 5/- now paid on salaries of Rs. 30 per month or over shall be discontinued.
3. The subscription of the employe and the Railway bonus shall be calculated according to the Indian rule.

(i) a subscription of 1/12th of salary and
 (ii) a bonus (a) equal to one half of such subscription, with (b) a second sum not exceeding one half of such subscription and also not exceeding one per cent of the net earnings on the Railway calculated before any contributions to the fund have been added to the working expenses.

4. The bonus will be charged against Abstract G of the Railway Estimate.

The details of the scheme, e.g. the arrangements for the management of the Fund (by Trustees or otherwise), for the investment of the money, the interest (if any) to be allowed to subscribers &c. &c., will require careful consideration. My Lords must not therefore be understood as doing more, for the moment, than assenting to the general principle; and They must ask the Secretary of State to submit for Their consideration and approval the details of any scheme which may work out in consultation with the Authorities of the Protectorate.
