

2. Mr. de la Croix
was appointed an Assistant
Collector in British Central
Africa in July 1899,
transferred to the East
Africa Protectorate in
January 1901, and
promoted to be Collector
in April 1901.

3. He died at Murnois
in the G.P. in the
5th of June of
Blackwater Fever,
suffering on repeated
attacks of malarial
fever contracted in the
unhealthy districts on
which he had been
stationed.

4. In view of the
straitened circumstances
of Mrs. de la Croix
