salary of £400 a year. He had,
however, had more than 13 years service
via permissible apprenticeship. His
total for 2 service and supernumerary amount
to more than 17 years. As he
had thoroughly fitted for his
present post, we may very well
allow him to remain in the force. To agree to
allow him pension at £450 -

Secretary at a salary of £450 per year.

In Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 11th ultime
(36048/1907), the Earl of Elgin recommends the following
appointments in the Agricultural Department of the East
Africa Protectorate, viz:-

- (1) Chief of the Economic Plant Division (now held by
Mr. H. Powell), and
- (2) Manager of the Government Stock Farm, Nairobi
(now held by Mr. J.W. Hill)

be made permanent and pensionable as from the dates on
which these officers respectively assumed duty.

The Lord Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury
will offer no objection to the proposal; but they consider
that the salaries attached to the posts which were
approved at their present amounts, vizt. £500 per annum on
the assumption that the offices would be unremunerative,
should be adjusted for consideration of the grant of pension
rights, on the principle set out in paragraph 11 of Mr.
Antrobus's letter (2928) of 24th February 1906, and they
must make their sanction conditional on such adjustment.

They suggest that the salaries of the posts as
pensionable may fairly be fixed at £460.
