I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 26th instant, bearing on your letter of the 15th instant, addressed to the Uplands Syndicate, and beg to say in reply that we regret that Lord Elgin is unable to comply with our application for a grant of land and forest necessary to the successful establishment of a Bacon Factory.

Under the circumstances my Syndicate accept the terms of the grant contained in your letter of 11th June, and further agree to the establishment of a Bacon Factory to cost not less than £10,000.
