and especially his successful
management of his estate in
Aireborough, should be looked

given a larger grant than

to make such good use of
the land. I suggested to
him that he should set out
his argument in writing,
and he will do so. If he
is all that he says he is
— and I see no reason to
doubt it, I think that it w^d
be a very good thing for the
country to let him to take
a hand in developing it.
