With reference to my interview with Lt. Colonel [redacted] and his [redacted] for the East Africa Province, and the officials at [redacted] Office regarding the [redacted] for which application has been made by my agent Mr. [redacted] [redacted]. I have the honor to submit the following observations as to what I wish done regarding the properties [redacted]

Mr. Poulin was sent by me to Eastport
and August under an agreement with the owners
to collect and sell our timber. He was given
a bill of exchange for the amount of
the sum received for the logs suitable for lumber
and five hundred bushels, and he was instructed to
apply for one vice in his name, for one in that
of his son, or son-in-law, and for one in that of Mr. W.
Sullivan, but he

for the purpose of the two last applications he held Powers Attorney. From them, these he has signed and exercised. That is now only particular of the last, a bill for Mr. Lady Mackenzie's name and his own near & alinda have reached you, the application in Mr. Burton's name for a 10,000 acre block near Wite, though stated by him to have been made, has not yet been reported on.

I propose for the moment to take up the 20,000 acres selected by him near Lalindi in the mud land between the two rivers. I have not yet ascertained its name, that being sufficient at present for the purposes I have in view, and I cannot now longer wait for information regarding the

when the report thereon shall have reached you, we
can easily arrange to incorporate this property in
the company's possessions should everything be in
order, and it be deemed advisable.

The two areas of 10,000 acres each near Malindi,
of which I am informed temporary occupation has been
granted, are to be considered as one estate for the
purpose of transference to the company now being
formed to work and develop them, and I do not wish
them to be divided except with your permission at
request.

Should anything unforeseen happen, and
the formation of the company not take place, it may
then be necessary for me to obtain your permission
to allow the two blocks to be dealt with separately,
giving Mr. Foulkes, perhaps, control of the one
applied for in his name, and Lady Mackenzie control
of that applied for by her under her P.M., and granted
to her or her nominee, subject of course to the
requirement of the land laws of the Protectorate
for their respective development being complied with
by the grantee or their nominees. For the present,
however, I desire to control and deal with the two
10,000 acre areas as a whole for the purpose of
the company's vision.

I have handed to Mr. Miller the two rough tracings
forwarded to me from Nairobi showing approximately
the location of the lands applied for, and
I should be glad if you will kindly give instructions
for a copy of the ordnance survey of the district
near Malindi known as Sheet 94 - 0 to be prepared
showing the two blocks of 10,000 acres in Lady
Mackenzie's and Mr. Foulkes' names marked thereon
and have it sent to me.

It will be observed that you have recently
pointed out to me the existing need of such a map?

I shall also be obliged if you will now subscribe
to my Action to draw up an Agreement on the usual
lines between themselves or acting for the Colonial
Service and somebody who I shall nominate, whereby
the lands specified in the Schedule annexed to the
Agreement, being the 20,000 acres before mentioned,
shall be granted to my nominee for the purpose of
transferring to the Company we shall then have formed
in due consideration of his undertaking to form within
six months from the date thereof a Limited Liability
Company having a nominal capital of not less than
£100,000. Wherof the sum of not less than £20,000
shall be specifically allocated and set aside for
the development of these 20,000 acres for the purpose
of growing and developing cotton and fibres in
strict accordance with the existing Land laws of
the Protectorate, and with the terms expressed in
the letter received by me from the Colonial Office
dated April 7th 1901.

Timber rights, and the right to gather and
cultivate rubber in these 20,000 acres should be
dealt with in this agreement, and powers given accord-
ingly; and general powers for utilising the Sabaki
river for motive power and irrigation for the purposes
of the estate should be included subject to the
usual restrictions.

I desire also powers to be given to construct
all necessary roads, buildings, factories and other
works for the development and benefit of the estate
under the general regulations of the Government;
and further to build a tramway or light railway if
deemed advisable from the property to the port of
Mblindi at the cost of the Company, subject of course
to such conditions and restrictions as the Government
may impose. I mention this as Mr. ... pointed out
pointed out to me the existing need of such a road

of transport to the coast, and this the Company
may later on undertake to carry out.

8. I shall be glad to confer with the Crown Agents
as to any suggestions or amendments they may have
to make regarding this Agreement so that the matter
may be carried through entirely with their wishes
and with those of the Colonial Office as expeditiously
as possible.
