1. I am sorry that I overlooked this part on 25003. We fixed 2/6 as the daily rate of allowance for officers who had to find their own quarters, i.e. furnished lodgings.

2. In the case of officers provided with quarters in barracks we sanctioned 1/- p.d. to cover hire of furniture, etc, as barrack quarters are unfurnished. It now appears that the D.C. charge 1/- p.d. for these quarters is that it costs an officer 2/- p.d. to live in them.

3. We must do in the case of (2) what we do in that of (1), i.e. give an officer the alternative to pay for furnished quarters.

Officers in barracks should therefore draw lodging allowance at the rate of 2/- p.d. (as against 2/6 in the case of others).

4. I think that under these circumstances it would be simpler to give an allowance of 2/6 p.d. whether an officer is in barracks or not, & let him do whichever he prefers. The majority will, I expect, have to come out as there are only a few at available barracks, so that the extra expenses will not amount to anything appreciable. A barrack room furnished with whatever things can be hired for 1/- p.d. is ~~no~~ ^{surely} likely to be as comfortable as furnished lodgings.

5. If you agree, I would suggest that Mr. Byles be informed that upon re-consideration it has been decided to allow all officers to draw lodging allowance at the

rate of 2/6 p.d. whether being -

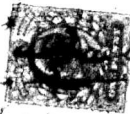
