To the Secretary of State
for the Colonies.

Sir: I have the honour to request
that you will authorize your authorities
in British East Africa to grant a lease
of 5000 acres of land to Captain Arthur
Alexander Slater & Major Algernon East
Cape, conjointly. We have both
called on Mr Ellis this day at the Colonial
Office & have, I trust & believe
proved to his satisfaction, that should
we decide upon taking up the land, we
should be in possession of the Capital
of £1000- stipulated before a lease
is granted. I should be glad if the
matter is treated as urgent & a
reply sent to me before the 10th
inst: on which date we shall go
to Africa - We request that this
