We, the undersigned J. Will, Principal Medical Officer, W.J. Radford, Medical Officer, and F.L. Henderson, Medical Officer, East Africa, do hereby certify that we, on the 31st day of January, 1907, at Nairobi East Africa, personally examined Everard Francis Webster, Assistant Collector, Karungu, and that the said E.F. Webster is a person of unsound mind and a proper person to be taken charge of, and detained under care and treatment, and that we have formed this opinion on the following grounds:

That he has attempted to commit suicide by shooting himself; that his manner has considerably altered, and that there is still a suicidal tendency as shown by his general behaviour. He has been despondent for some months, and states that he is a failure in life. He is further reticent and suspicious.
