Mr Concert was appointed an Ass. Dist. Officer at Bonded on 1902 (5 Nov), affixed by Collector in E.A.P. Oct. 27 1904 after 6 mos. that he could have on hand for urgent private affairs without paying money or fees.

Being unable to settle his private affairs in less than 6 mos. he asked to be placed on the suspended list. This was not granted & his resignation was accepted on the understanding that he would not apply for the return of the £55. 1905 refd. 9 apr 1906

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of
your despatch No. 403 of September 7th informing me
of the resignation of Mr. E. S. W. Conant. This
officer, previous to his departure from England to
take up his appointment here, signed an agreement
with the Crown Agents to the effect that, in the
event of his leaving the Protectorate within three
years of the date of his arrival (November 16th 1904)

he would refund the sum of fifty five pounds. In view
of Mr. Conant's previous service in Somaliland, it may
be decided not to insist on this requirement.
