

Subject. Effects of the injudictous use of alcohol on the health of Mr. Murray.

Mr. Murray suffered from Chronic Castritis with occasional acute exacerbations. In this condition alcohol should be entirely avoided, and its injudications use undoubtedly does aggravate the disease, depending mainly on the amount consumed.

It would however be difficult to estimate to what extent the condition which necessitated Mr. Murray being invalided was affected in this respect as I have no knowledge of the quantity used.

There is no record of Mr. Murray ever having come under medical treatment for "alcoholism".
