The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to
the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Received Colonial Office 3.10 p.m. 12th March, 1908.

No.54. I am selling 3,000 of the Kissi cattle by
auction. Opportunity now offers of helping the bona
fide settler to stock and representations have been
made to me from all sides. Propose to allow all bona
fide owners of farms to purchase cattle at the auc-
tions up to £100 paying one quarter at the time half
the balance in one year and remainder in another
year on the condition that (cattle?) so purchased
do not leave their purchaser for two years without
permission. Agreements as noted in inclosure in my
despatch No.410 28th July 1906 under which no cattle
have been given yet. Council thoroughly concur and
Macdonald is most emphatic the conditions will tend
to enhance sale and any risk will be more than
counterbalanced by general good to the country.
Do you approve of proposed arrangements?
