Telegram from the Officer Administering the Government of the East Africa Protectorate to Mr Lyttelton.

(Received Colonial Office 7.7 p.m. 25th October 1905.)

No. 204:

By despatch of 5th October No. 537 Henderson now in England on leave has left the country heavily indebted. It is feared there may be considerable trouble if he returns. It would be desirable to arrange pending receipt of despatch. It would be possible to arrange with the Government of India for McCaskin to remain until new report of General arrives. He is due to leave here 16th November. Henderson's address is care of the Crown Agents for the Colonies.
