THE EAST AFRICA MATTER'S BANK ORDINANCE 1908.

Section 1.	Establishment of Post Office Savings Bank.
Section 2.	Uganda Treasury shall be Bank of Uganda 1908, and shall be Post Office Savings Bank "Responsible". Provided, it further is in the best interest of the Savings Bank, a majority provision can it pay to Postmaster to the Post Office Savings Bank one hundred and twenty five thousand shillings per annum.
Section 3.	Section 2 of the Uganda Ordinance.
Section 4.	Section 4 of the Uganda Ordinance.

The provisions of section 30 of the Uganda
ordinance with regard to the payment on the death of
a depositor who is a native of the Protectorate have
not been inserted in East Africa's ordinance as in
this Protectorate there exists no reason for taking
the funds belonging to natives out of the revision
of sections 30 and 31.

Sections 31 and 32 of the Uganda Ordinance with
regard to dividing the funds of a depositor being
trustable and dying intestate or the funds of a
depositor dying intestate and leaving illegitimate
relations have not been inserted in the East African
ordinance. In regard to the European population the
condition of things would make the insertion of such
provision in the English code advisable is nonexistent
in this Protectorate. So far the natives of the
country are concerned it may be taken that they would
infinitely prefer that their funds should be distri-
buted according to their customs and customs.
