## EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

My Lord,

*For M.M.*  
 In continuation of my telegram No. 90 of  
 the 12th ultimo I have the honour to submit copy  
 of a letter from the Manager of the Uganda Railway  
 on the subject of the establishment of officers  
 for the Lake Steamers, and the question of quarters  
 for married officers.

2. As regards establishment the matter is set at  
 rest by Your Lordship's telegram of the 30th May  
 intimating that Captain Wright's appointment terminates  
 on the 12th instant.

3. At the request of the Manager Uganda Railway  
 I have approved of the provisional promotion of  
 Mr. Blencowe to Captain and of Mr. Bruce to Chief  
 Officer. Mr. Burrie has every confidence in the  
 capacity of both gentlemen, and I would ask Your  
 Lordship to sanction these appointments.

4. The Lake Staff then stands as follows:-

Captains.	Chief Officers.	2nd Officers.

Gray	Kell	Dugdale
Blencowe	Bruce	Hampden.

5. As regards married officers Your Lordship will see Mr. Currie's observations with which I agree. Both Mr. Wearne and Mr. Dugdale state that they were given to understand at the Colonial Office that there would be no difficulty about giving them accommodation for their wives. Mrs. Dugdale however did not accompany her husband.

6. I would ask if this is the case: for if so we shall either have to build houses for them or else give them a house allowance, which, as no accommodation is available at Kisumu would not help them much in obtaining quarters there.

7. In the meanwhile I am passing no orders on paragraph 3 of Mr. Currie's letter.

I have the honour to report that Mr. A.R. WEARN 08  
the recently appointed 2nd officer has applied for a  
house at Port Florence as he expects his wife out from  
England in September next.

Mr. Wearn states that he was given to understand  
by the Colonial Office before leaving England that  
accommodation would be provided for his wife out here.

We have at present absolutely no accommodation  
at Port Florence or elsewhere for the families of  
officers on our steamers. Moreover the nature of  
the duties of 2nd Officers necessitate their remaining  
on their boats when in port so that to have married  
men in these ports with their wives in this country  
can only lead to inefficiency and discontent.

8. I am informed by Mr. Wearn that Mr. Dugdale the  
last 2nd Officer to be appointed and who sailed on  
the 10th instant is bringing his wife out with him.  
Will you please ascertain by wire whether this is so  
and if possible have her stopped.

I must point out the great inconvenience caused by  
the appointment of married men in junior positions  
of this sort without reference to us.

9. I have the honour to enquire whether His Excellency  
authorises me to build houses for them as it cost  
must submit supplementary estimates for the current

year. Each house will cost at least £650 and if we allow 2nd Officers to have their wives here other officers are sure to ask for the same privilege and we shall probably have a demand for 5 or 6 such houses within the next year or so.

4. This is bad enough but as I have already pointed out it will I fear lead to inefficiency. If therefore the Colonial Office has given a guarantee that accommodation will be provided for their wives, it will, in my opinion, be cheaper in the end to terminate their agreements under usual clause and return them to Europe.
